Like many websites we use cookies to store small pieces of information on your computer or other device when you visit. This information is used to make the site work, to help a user navigate the site, improve the website experience, and store preferences such as login information and buyer wish-lists.

To do this, the website uses Essential and Non-Essential Cookies

Essential Cookies enable the website to work and are necessary for the website to provide the functions and services that it offers.

Non-Essential Cookies are not strictly necessary for the basic operation of the site but help enhance your experience of using the site and help us analyse and understand how users navigate and make choices so that we can develop improvements on the site from time to time.

Third Parties:

All Essential Cookies are placed on the site by ArtMakers. However as explained in our Privacy Policy, we also have links to some 3rd party sites such as Google Analytics and Hotjar who help us understand and analyse how users move around the site and the popularity of different services. Other 3rd Parties include ArtPlacer and 'Online Gallery' who provide additional services to our members, AddtoAny who enable us to link to social media platforms and MailChimp who distribute our newsletter.
